Reception

This half term we have been very busy with our topic 'Bears.' In our English lessons we have been learning the story 'We're going on a bear hunt' through our Talk for Writing. We made and labelled our own maps and went on our own bear hunt. We also enjoyed changing parts of the story to go on our own animal hunt. We have also learnt about different bears and have enjoyed writing facts about them using simple punctuation.

In maths, we have been looking at different representations of numbers 1–7. We have also been exploring the properties of 2D shapes.



In understanding the world, we found out about how Chinese New Year is celebrated and explored shadow puppets in our cave.



Year 1

In Year 1, we have been reading 'The Tin Forest' and have written dairies about what we could see from the small house. We have also been learning about number bonds to 10 in maths.

In Art, we have been learning about the artist named Henry Rousseau and have been drawing with charcoal and using different type of pencils.

We have had a gymnastics coach for PE and have enjoyed acting like butterflies, balancing and warm up games.



In Science, we have been learning about plants, flowers and trees and really enjoyed planting sunflowers and peas.

Year 2

This half term, Year 2 have been exploring Life on Earth. We found out about the life cycle of a bee and wrote our own explanation texts on the life cycle of an Emperor penguin and a butterfly.

In Art, we designed and created our own prints of Life on Earth.

In Science, we have been exploring what is living, dead and has never been alive as well as exploring microhabitats of minibeasts. All of this knowledge came in very useful at Chester Zoo this week!

In RE, we have been learning about the ministry of Jesus through his miracles and parables.



Year 3

This half term in PE, we've taken on lots of activities and challenges to develop our teamwork skills.

In DT, we had the exciting opportunity to taste, design and create our own soups!

In English, we've been exploring The Iron Man, having lots of fun acting out scenes and analysing character descriptions.

We were also very lucky to go on a fantastic trip to Chester Zoo!



Year 5

Year 5 have been busy this half term! The children have developed their hockey skills and become talented at moving with the ball at pace.



In Spanish, we have continued to describe how we get from A to B and the children's pronunciation is 'muy bien' (very good).

There has been a lot of drama in History as we delved into The Ancient Greeks and we have learnt so much about Greek Gods and their powers.

Year 4

In English, we have been writing non-chronological reports, have learnt how to use direct and reported speech and how to use description in our writing.

We have been learning how to divide 2 digit numbers by one digit and our 7, 8, and 4 times tables in maths and have created torches in DT.



In our PE lessons, we have been learning how to run, jump and hop in athletics. In Science, we have been learning and experimenting with states of matter: solid, gas, and liquid.

Year 6

In English, Y6 have been busy writing journey tales using our novel: 'Running Wild' by Michael Morpurgo as inspiration.

We have further developed our understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages in our maths lessons and have been incredibly excited learning about (and growing!) micro-organisms in Science.



We have loved learning about the Maya civilisation this half term and especially enjoyed a visit from Maya archaeologist Dr Diane, who taught us so much about this time period. We were also lucky enough to have a video call with a school based in this area in Guatemala to find out about everyday life over there and how it compares to ours!
