This term has been filled with curiosity, creativity, and hard work, and we are so proud of the progress our children have made in their academic and personal development.


We look forward to your continued support in the next steps of their learning and hope you all have a lovely Easter half term!

Age Restrictions for Social Media Platforms



Reception

This half term in English, we've been exploring *The Very Hungry Caterpillar* and even wrote our own butterfly diaries. In Maths, we've been practicing counting up to 20, learning how to double numbers, and having lots of fun with the Numberblocks!

Throughout our Science lessons, we've discovered the fascinating life cycle of a butterfly and explored how it grows and changes.

In *Come and See*, we've focused on Palm Sunday and created palm leaves to symbolise this special occasion.

Finally, we've absolutely loved our gymnastics lessons this half term, where we've been learning how to balance and move creatively around the room.



Year 1

In English, we've enjoyed reading *How to Wash a Woolly Mammoth* and have used it as inspiration to write our own sets of instructions.

In DT, we've developed our weaving skills, creating some wonderful pieces of art.

In History, we've been learning about the inspiring Kitty Wilkinson, and we even had the privilege of a special visit from her, where she shared all about her remarkable life!

Finally, we had the wonderful opportunity to share our singing talents with our families this week, creating a special moment for everyone.



Year 2

In English this half term, we've been reading *Rumpelstiltskin* and have used this book as inspiration to write our own defeating a monster tale. In Maths, we've been mastering how to multiply by 2s, 5s, and 10s, building our confidence with times tables.



In Science, we've been exploring different habitats in the UK and around the world, learning how animals and plants thrive in various environments.

In History, we've explored Quarry Bank Mill and discovered what life was like for children who worked there during the Industrial Revolution.

We've also been getting creative in DT, learning the running stitch and using this to create our own bags.

Year 3

This half term in Science, we've been exploring all different types of rocks, discovering their unique properties and how they form.

In Art, we've been studying the work of artist Georgia O'Keeffe, exploring her unique style and creating our own pieces.

We've been learning how to use GarageBand in Computing, experimenting with different sounds and creating our own music.

In Geography, we've been studying volcanoes, learning about their structure, eruptions, and the impact they have on the environment.

We've also had a great time in our gymnastics PE lessons, developing our flexibility, strength, and balance.

Year 4

We've thoroughly enjoyed reading our class novel *Hodgeheg* in English, following the adventures of Max the hedgehog.

This half term in Science, we've been exploring the fascinating topic of sound, discovering how it travels and how we hear it.



In Art, we've studied the work of Wassily Kandinsky, experimenting with abstract shapes and vibrant colours inspired by his style.

In History, we've delved into the fascinating world of the Tudors and had an amazing workshop, where we learned so many interesting facts about this remarkable time in history.

Year 5

In Science this half term, we've been investigating the properties of different materials and learning about their uses.

Linking with our English work and our class novel *Percy Jackson*, we've explored countries near the equator, with a special focus on Greece in our Geography lessons.

We've also been creating movable posters in DT and we've loved our dance lessons, creating dances that represent countries from around the world.



Finally, Y5 have been working with Singtastic! this half term and were lucky enough to perform in one of their concerts.

Year 6

This half term, we have enjoyed learning about the impact of deforestation in English and Geography through our class novel: 'Running Wild' by Michael Morpurgo and 'The Great Kapok Tree' by Lynne Cherry. We have used this as inspiration to write our own descriptive poems and persuasive letters.

We have also loved our Science lessons and experiments involving the heart and how to stay healthy, as well as our weekly dance lessons, with Olympic sport related dances.

However, the highlight has to be our trip to The Playhouse Theatre to see *Pig Heart Boy* due to our fantastic behaviour and staying green all half term!
