Reception

This half term we have really enjoyed our topic 'At sea.'

In our English lessons, we have been learning the story 'The Treasure of Pirate Frank' through our Talk for Writing. We have been finding out about pirates and making and labelling our own treasure maps.

Last week, we ended the year by all getting dressed up as pirates and having a pirate picnic at the park.

In maths, we have been using rekenreks to consolidate everything we have done over the year.



Year 1

In our final half term of Year 1, we went on a trip to the beach to find human and physical features of the coast and also to the park to identify signs of summer and flower names we know.

We have been exploring and learning about money with our role play ice cream shop in maths and have read the story 'What the Sea-Saw' in English, innovating our own versions. We have also designed, made and evaluated windmills in DT.

We also took part in a Chester Zoo project, where we learnt about sustainable palm oil and got to hold real bones of animals and a huge snake skin.



Year 2

This half term, we have been learning the story of Queen Victoria's Bathing Machine, a wishing tale based on how the first bathing machine was invented.

In DT, we have designed and created our own vehicles using wheels, axels and a chassis.

We have also been learning about the history of New Brighton beach and the Victorian seaside holiday. We topped it off with a visit to New Brighton in the sun!



Year 3

Year 3 have had a fantastic time this term, filled with fun and exciting learning opportunities!

In Geography, we enjoyed a brilliant field trip to LIPA, where we explored our local environment.

In RE, we learned about Islam and Judaism, and we were very lucky to take part in a virtual tour of a synagogue, which brought our learning to life.

We also had the amazing opportunity to be part of a Palm Oil workshop run by Chester Zoo, where we learned all about sustainability and how we can help protect our planet.



Year 4

This term, we've had a fantastic time exploring a range of exciting topics in class. In Art, we learned how to sew and used different textiles to create landscape collages. During PE, we enjoyed playing team games and developing our cooperation skills in outdoor activities.

In Science, we explored the water cycle as part of our States of Matter topic and learned how water changes state and moves through the environment.

In RE, we found out what it means to be one of God's people and learned about inspiring saints.

We also showcased our musical talents by playing the clarinet in a special concert for our parents – a proud moment for everyone!

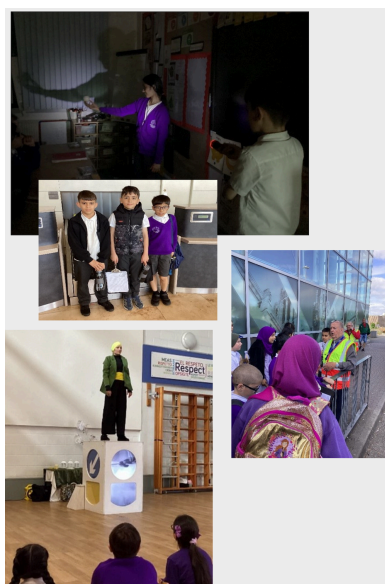


Year 5
