Nursery

Nursery have settled well this half term. Our learning has been linked to the book, 'Happy To Be Me' by Emma Dodd. We have been naming different parts of our body and discovering what we can do with our hands and feet. We have also enjoyed using our mouth to taste different foods and our nose to discover which smells we like and which we don't like.



Reception

This half term we have been really busy with our topic 'Me and my family'.

We have started our daily phonic lessons and are really trying our best to read and write the sounds we learn every day. In our English lessons, we have been learning the story 'Goldilocks and The Three Bears'. We have role-played the story and have started writing key words from the story before writing them in a simple sentence.

In maths, we have been subitising amounts to 5. We have also used maths equipment to learn about more than, fewer than and equal to.

We have also been finding out about our 5 senses and have started observing the changes outside that are happening at the moment as it is Autumn.

Year 1

In English, we have read the story of 'Little Red Riding Hood' and then have retold the story and created our own. In maths, we have been learning to count to 100 in different ways including forwards, backwards and in 10s.

In RE, we have been learning about the wonderful world that God created and how it can be looked after. In Science, we have been exploring materials and conducted an investigation to find out the best material for the three little pigs to build a house with.

We have been learning about healthy food choices and how to make a healthy sandwich in DT. In History, we have been learning about chronology and then about Mary Seacole during Black History Month.



Year 2

This half term, we have been learning about the Great Fire of London across the curriculum. We even got to experience a Samuel Pepys workshop with our very own guest Samuel Pepys! We had so much fun learning about life in 1666 and the changes that the Great Fire of London has made to the UK. We got to practice quill writing, acting like King Charles the 2nd and finding out about old tools used to help in fires.

In DT, we have also been learning about making bread. We have practised different skills needed to make bread and created our own bread with different shapes, toppings and fillings.
